A. Goldstein vs. Village of Mamaroneck

Trustee Lucas made a motion to enter into Executive Session pursuant §105(1)d of the Public Officers Law to discuss matters of current litigation., which was seconded by Trustee Wenstrup:

A. WJWW Filtration Plant

Mayor Murphy stated that the Harrison Planning Board and the Westchester Joint Water Works are lead agencies as the project is in Harrison. The resolution tonight is not to approve the project but will give authorization to begin the process of determining if this is a viable plan. Hopefully, they will determine that it is a Type II action under SEQRA. Trustee Lucas stated that this needs to be determined for planning purposes and asked what the Village is committing for the study. Mayor Murphy informed her that the Village is not committing any amount for the study. Trustee Lucas believes that the Village needs to appropriate funds and if so, how much? Mayor Murphy stated that he does not think there is a number yet.

Deputy Attorney Mason stated that she spoke with the attorney for WJWW and a joint project needs to be established and that the NYS Comptroller will send funds for the invoices already in the pipeline.

Trustee Natchez suggested establishing an amount of \$5,000 and the Board can increase this if needed at a later time. Trustee Tafur stated that it is not clear what is being done here. The action needs to be clarified and added in a Resolved clause. Mayor Murphy reminded the Board that he has requested numerous times that if they have questions about a WJWW action, to please let him know, as a courtesy, before the meeting so that he can have an answer. This happens all the time.

Deputy Attorney Mason stated that she will clarify with the attorney for the WJWW and will have an answer and if needed a revised Resolution for the Special Meeting scheduled for August 17, 2020.
