Hello,

My name is Emily Durand. I'm writing to encourage (and I hope inspire) you to create a municipal food scrap pick up program. My family and I moved to the Village about a year and a half ago, and one of the selling features for me was actually the food scrap program and the industrious young people willing to pick it up for me. I grew up in a small town in Canada, where my family had maintained a compost pile all year long (yes, I remember having to put on my boots and trudge through the snow to put the days scraps out in the container). When I went to university in Kingston Ontario, the city required that food scraps be separated and were picked up for composting. Not only did this create useful, healthy compost, but it significantly decreased what was sent to turn into methane in a landfill.

According to the EPA, food takes up more space in US landfills than anything else. We each throw away roughly 219lbs per person annually. In the landfill environment food waste decays into greenhouse gases which contribute to global warming instead of being converted into something healthy we can give back to our land.

I spend a lot of time talking to my kids about not wasting our resources, and caring for our planet. I really hope that you'll consider establishing a municipal pick up program. I know we'll be out there encouraging all of our neighbours to participate!

As a new resident of Mamaroneck a few years ago, I found myself driving over to drop off my foodscraps, frequently soiling my car (and myself) in the process. I knew there had to be a better solution, and that is when I found ASAP scraps. I am so impressed with the ingenuity and resourcefulness these young people have demonstrated, and I am most hopeful that we can continue their efforts without backsliding into people tossing food into the landfill because they can't be bothered to make the trip to the sanitation department. Or, find it difficult to do so during the hours of operation, which I encountered many times.

We are a community who has experienced firsthand the environmental impacts that can come from overuse and overreliance of landfills. I hope we can move together to a point of making composting second nature, and easy to do.

I would like to see the Village consider one of the following:

1) Add compost/food scrap pickups to regular sanitation routes
